 - What It Means: The phrase highlights shifting values and questions what "goodness" truly means in a flawed world.
- 4. "She said she thought the house was in Tennessee."
 - What It Says: The grandmother realizes she was mistaken about the location of the old house.
 - What It Means: Her selfish manipulation causes the detour that leads to disaster, symbolizing how error and sin set tragedy in motion.
- 5. "People are certainly not nice like they used to be."
 - What It Says: The grandmother laments about the state of society.
 - What It Means: Her nostalgic view is hypocritical; she criticizes others but fails to recognize her own flaws.
- 6. "It's no real pleasure in life."
 - What It Says: The Misfit explains his worldview after the killings.
 - What It Means: This bleak statement shows his despair and rejection of meaning, contrasting with the grandmother's last grasp of grace.
