Instructions: Below are ten statements about characters, creatures, and events in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Some are drawn from **mythology** (fact), while others are **Shakespeare's own inventions** (fiction). Write **F** for Fact (mythological reference) or **N** for Fiction (Shakespeare's invention).

F/N

- Oberon is a king of the fairies borrowed from medieval and mythological traditions.
- 2. Titania, queen of the fairies, comes directly from Greek mythology.
- 3. Theseus, Duke of Athens, and Hippolyta, Queen of the Amazons, are figures taken from ancient myths.
- 4. Puck, or Robin Goodfellow, is a mischievous sprite from English folklore.
- 5. The love potion made from a flower struck by Cupid's arrow is Shakespeare's invention.
- Nick Bottom, the weaver with a donkey's head, comes from Roman mythology.
- 7. The changeling boy over whom Oberon and Titania quarrel is Shakespeare's invention.
- 8. Helena and Hermia, two Athenian women entangled in love troubles, are rooted in Greek myth.
- 9. The idea of fairies blessing marriages at the end of the play is Shakespeare's invention.
- 10. The play-within-a-play, "Pyramus and Thisbe," is borrowed from Ovid's *Metamorphoses*.
