Teacher's Guide

- Have students read their corrected versions aloud, emphasizing correct pronunciation of vowel and consonant sounds.

Extension Activities:

- Ask students to write a new short paragraph about a real or imagined trip using both a and an correctly.
- Encourage students to highlight or color-code the articles after editing to visualize their correct usage.
