Fixed Michael Jordan Version (Sample):

"I don't play to be decent-I play to dominate. Every shot I take, I take to win, and every game I step on the court, I expect nothing less than victory."

Why: Jordan's voice is competitive, driven, and focused on winning. He would never settle for calling his team "decent."
