## **Rating Guide**

- 1 = Totally Safe No private or identifying info.
- 2 = Mostly Safe Minor details, but still okay in most contexts.

- **5 = Oversharing** Shares personal data, location, or private info that could be misused.
- 1. Rating: 4 Why: Reveals that no one is home and gives timing info about a parent's job a safety and location risk.
- 2. Rating: 5 Why: Shows sensitive personal information (name, address, ID number) on the license major privacy violation.
- 3. Rating: 3 Why: Shares a specific meeting time and place; fine in private, but risky if posted publicly.
- 4. Rating: 4 Why: Reveals personal emotional details that could invite unwanted or unsafe attention.
- 5. Rating: 5 Why: Shares a home address and event time serious safety concern.
- 6. Rating: 2 Why: Generally safe, though a visible logo or location could identify where the student volunteers.
- 7. Rating: 5 Why: Posts a personal phone number unsafe and could lead to spam or harassment.
- 8. Rating: 3 Why: Mostly fine, but posting pictures of others without consent can violate their privacy.
- 9. Rating: 4 Why: Announces travel plans and absence from home, creating a security risk.
