

Dilemmas Through Lewis's Lens Answer Key

Ethical Dilemma 1 - Artificial Intelligence and Human Judgment

- **Lewis's likely response:** He would caution against entrusting moral decisions to machines, since AI lacks the grounding in objective value necessary for true judgment.
- **Why:** Lewis argued that reducing morality to mechanism strips humanity of responsibility, leading to domination by "controllers."

Ethical Dilemma 2 - Designer Babies

- **Lewis's likely response:** He would oppose this, seeing it as humans exercising total control over nature and each other.
- **Why:** This aligns with his warning that full control of human nature results in "the abolition of man," where people become products, not persons.

Ethical Dilemma 3 - "My Truth" Culture

- **Lewis's likely response:** He would strongly reject moral subjectivism in education, warning it produces "men without chests" who cannot cultivate virtue.
- **Why:** He argued moral education must shape sentiments to align with the Tao (universal moral law).

Reflection Prompt (Sample)

Lewis might find **designer babies** the most urgent, since it represents humanity's attempt to fully control itself and erase natural moral boundaries. This is closest to his fear of abolishing what it means to be human.
