Sample Responses

- Clues: quiet tone, teacher speaking → behave by sitting still, listening, and following directions.
- 2. Clues: loud music, laughter → behave by smiling, joining conversation, and keeping energy friendly.
- 3. Clues: speaker talking, audience focused \rightarrow behave by listening quietly and showing respect.
- 4. Clues: formal clothes, soft voices → behave by using polite table manners and a calm tone.
- 5. Clues: cheering crowd, outdoor setting → behave by clapping, celebrating respectfully, and keeping it positive.

Teacher's Guide

Skill Focus: Encourages students to interpret **context cues** (environment, tone, dress, and social expectations) to adapt behavior appropriately across different settings.

Differentiation Tips:

- Model two opposite settings (formal vs. casual) and have students identify visible clues.
- Offer sentence starters such as "I can tell this is a quiet place because..." for emerging writers.
- Pair verbal learners with visual learners to enhance observation and discussion.

Engagement Ideas:

- Use photos of real-life settings (classroom, restaurant, playground) for students to describe behavior clues.
- Have students role-play a situation twice-first using incorrect behavior, then correct behavior-to compare reactions.

Extension Ideas:

- Ask students to write a short paragraph describing how behavior changes between two chosen environments.
- Create a "Social Detective Wall" where students post examples of context clues they noticed during the week.
