Teacher's Guide

- Review that one whole is reached when the numerator equals the denominator.
- Encourage students to estimate first by comparing the total numerator to the denominator before calculating.
- Have students explain why they chose less than 1, equal to 1, or greater than 1 before finding the exact sum.
- Provide fraction strips or circles for students who benefit from visual models.
- Invite students to sort completed problems into three groups: less than 1, equal to 1, and greater than 1.
- Extend the activity by having students write one example for each category and challenge a partner to classify and solve it.
