3.	<b>Leaving Carthage</b> - Was he compelled entirely by Mercury's message from Jupiter, or did he freely accept his duty?
4.	Journey to the Underworld - Did prophecy force him there, or did he freely seek knowledge from Anchises?
5.	<b>Killing Turnus</b> - Was this the unavoidable end fated for Italy, or a personal act of vengeance and choice?

- "Destiny's Lawyer" arguing Aeneas was ruled by Fate.
- "Free Will's Lawyer" arguing Aeneas made his own choices.
