Teacher Guide

- This worksheet strengthens political geography skills and helps students become familiar with major African countries and their capitals.
- For grades 3 to 5, review the difference between a country and a capital before starting and model one example.
- For grades 6 to 8, challenge students to describe one fact they know about any of the countries or capitals after matching them.
