Sample Response

Exploration's impact was both positive and negative, but overall it reshaped the world in ways that advanced global understanding and exchange. Explorers like **Vasco da Gama** opened new sea routes that expanded trade between Europe and Asia, creating new opportunities for wealth and cultural exchange. However, voyages like **Columbus's** also led to colonization, disease, and the loss of Indigenous lands. While exploration promoted innovation and knowledge, it also caused suffering for many native peoples. Therefore, the Age of Exploration should be remembered as a time of great discovery but also as a turning point that introduced global inequality and cultural change.

Teacher's Guide

- **Purpose:** Encourages students to practice **critical analysis**, **argument writing**, and **historical reasoning** by weighing the benefits and consequences of exploration.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For emerging writers, provide sentence starters such as "One positive result was..." or "A negative effect of exploration was...".
 - Challenge advanced students to include references to **primary sources** or to compare perspectives from both European explorers and Indigenous peoples.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Host a mini "Exploration Debate" where students defend opposing views before writing their essays.
 - Display key maps or artifacts to help students visualize the real-world effects of exploration.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Have students write a reflection from the point of view of an Indigenous leader or European explorer.
 - Connect the lesson to modern exploration-students can compare 15th-century ocean voyages to space exploration today.
