Teacher's Guide

- **Purpose:** Builds understanding of the three main motives for exploration - **Gold (wealth)**, **Glory (fame and power)**, and **God (religious spread)** - while supporting categorization and comprehension skills.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For younger or struggling readers, provide brief definitions of each motive before starting.
 - For advanced learners, have them explain *why* they chose each motive or rewrite a sentence to fit another category.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Create a class anchor chart labeled *Gold*, *Glory*, and *God* and add student examples.
 - Let students act out short skits showing each motive through explorer "interviews."
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Ask students to research a specific explorer and identify which motive best fits their journey.
 - Compare motives of early explorers to motives for modern exploration, such as space travel or scientific discovery.
