### Teacher's Guide:

- **Differentiation:** For early learners, read the paragraph aloud and model identifying one pair at a time. Advanced students can underline antonyms before coloring.
- **Engagement Tip:** Let students choose their own color pairs for each antonym and explain why they picked those colors (e.g., red for "hot," blue for "cool").
