

Reverse Rewrite Answer Key

Sample Responses:

1. The short tower touched the clouds.
2. It was a warm morning when the kids went outside to play.
3. The sad puppy wagged its tail at everyone.
4. Our teacher asked us to speak in a quiet voice during the play.
5. The box felt light when I tried to lift it.
6. The dark stars sparkled in the sky last night.
7. After dinner, the children were asleep and full of dreams.
8. The late bird caught the worm after the others.
9. The path through the forest was wide and winding.
10. The test was hard, so everyone finished slowly.

Teacher's Guide:

- **Differentiation:** Allow struggling students to circle the antonyms first before rewriting the sentences. For advanced learners, challenge them to rewrite using both antonyms **and** new sentence structures.
- **Engagement Tip:** Turn it into a "Sentence Swap Relay": students swap papers with a partner and check if their antonym changes make sense.
- **Extension Idea:** Encourage students to create short stories where every sentence uses at least one antonym pair.
- **Cross-Grade Adaptation:** For higher grades, include more complex vocabulary (e.g., "ancient" ↔ "modern," "generous" ↔ "selfish") to deepen word understanding and context awareness.
