## **Socrates' Bold Voice Answer Key**

1. He refused emotional appeals because he believed they would dishonor truth and manipulate the jury instead of seeking justice.
2. Socrates believed his daimonion (divine sign) guided him and confirmed that defending philosophy was his divine mission.
3. His belief in virtue meant he argued with reason and integrity, not by trying to save himself through dishonesty.
4. By calling himself a gadfly, he explained that his questioning awakened Athenians to self-examine, even if it annoyed them.
5. He hoped to show Athenians that truth and philosophy are more valuable than life, teaching courage and integrity through example.
