### Part A: Sample Answers

1. Socrates likely meant that people should question their beliefs and actions instead of living blindly.
2. Self-reflection helps individuals grow in wisdom and societies avoid repeating mistakes.
3. Some may find happiness in routine, but Socrates argues true meaning comes from conscious reflection.

### Part B: Sample Journal Response

To live an examined life means to pause and reflect on whether your choices match your values. Socrates believed asking questions leads to **truth** and **virtue**. Without reflection, people may follow traditions blindly or live unjustly. In my own life, I find that examining my goals helps me make better decisions. Sometimes it is uncomfortable, but it prevents mistakes and leads to growth. For Socrates, an examined life was worth more than survival itself. His trial shows he preferred death over abandoning philosophy. Living this way means striving for honesty, integrity, and awareness.
