Exile vs. Death Answer Key

Sample Responses

- Socrates might not find life worthwhile if forced into silence, since he believed questioning was his divine mission.
- 2. In exile, he likely would continue questioning, risking punishment elsewhere, showing his mission transcended Athens.
- 3. Without his death, philosophy might lack the powerful example of a man dying for truth, weakening the lasting impact of his teachings.
- 4. His death inspired Plato and others to preserve his words; exile might not have created the same urgency.
