Teacher's Guide

Skill Focus: Students learn to **redirect off-topic or overly personal conversations** with kindness and respect, reinforcing self-control, empathy, and social boundaries.

Differentiation Tips:

- Read each dialogue aloud and have students hold up response cards labeled A-D to show their choice.

Engagement Ideas:
