

## Origins of Ashes Answer Key

### Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - For **Grades 7-8**, guide students in identifying cause-and-effect relationships in how traditions evolve.
  - For **Grades 9-10**, encourage students to connect historical developments to broader cultural or spiritual themes.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Compare how symbols like ashes are used in other religions or cultures to represent renewal.
  - Have students create a brief "timeline of transformation" showing how the ritual changed.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Assign a short essay: *How can ancient traditions still shape modern values?*
  - Encourage students to research one way Ash Wednesday is observed in a different country and present it to the class.
