Teacher's Guide

Teaching Tips

Differentiation Ideas

- Provide a shortened word bank for students who need fewer choices.
- Challenge advanced students to add one more original sentence using a landform not listed.
- Allow English learners to sketch simple icons beside each word in the bank to reinforce meaning.

Engagement Ideas

- Let students choose one landform and create a quick travel style fact card.
- Have students work with partners to explain why each landform is important to the regions around it.
