Formulating Deep Questions Answer Key

Again, student responses will vary, but here are examples of strong, labeled questions:

- 1. What idea did Amina have to help her village? (L)
 - ➤ She planned to dig a channel from the river to the crops.
- 2. Why did the elders not believe in Amina at first? (1)
 - They thought she was too young or that it was too hard for a child.
- 3. How did Amina inspire others to join her? (I)
 - ➤ By showing determination and working every day after school.
- 4. What is the main reason the crops grew stronger at the end of the story? (L)
 - ➤ Because the irrigation channel brought water to them.
- 5. What would have happened if Amina had given up? (E)
 - ➤ The village might have continued to struggle with food and water.
- 6. Do you think Amina was a leader? Why or why not? (E)
 - ➤ Yes, because she had a vision, took action, and inspired others.
- ✓ Look for balance in the types of questions and clear connections to the story.
