- 1. She is **in school** studying for her math test.
 - → Rewrite it to describe her **location outside of class**, not the activity.
- 2. Dad works at the hospital every weekday.
 - → Rewrite it to show he's **inside the building**, not just employed there.
- 3. The bird landed on the tree branch near the window.
 - \rightarrow Rewrite it to show the bird's **general location**, not a surface.
- 4. I met my best friend in the park yesterday.
 - \rightarrow Rewrite it to describe the **specific entrance** where you met.
- 5. The class starts at 9 o'clock sharp.
 - \rightarrow Rewrite it to refer to **a part of the day** instead of an exact time.
- 6. The family arrived **on Friday evening** for dinner.
 - → Rewrite it to describe the **exact time** they arrived.
- 7. We sat at the table to play a board game.
 - \rightarrow Rewrite it to describe the **items resting on the table**, not the position.
- 8. My cousins live in the city near the museum.
 - → Rewrite it to describe the **specific street** where they live.
- Our team played on the field for the championship.
 - → Rewrite it to describe being **inside the locker room** before the game.
- 10. She laughed at the joke until her sides hurt.
 - → Rewrite it to show she's **in the mood** for laughter, not reacting to one joke.
