The Life of Langston Hughes

Langston Hughes, one of America's most influential poets, was born in Joplin, Missouri, in 1902. His early childhood was spent with his grandmother, who told him stories that inspired his imagination. After graduating from high school in Cleveland in 1920, Hughes traveled to Mexico to visit his father. That same year, one of his first poems was published in *The Crisis*, a leading magazine for African American writers.

In 1921, Hughes enrolled at Columbia University, where he began to connect with writers of the Harlem Renaissance. He published his first book of poetry, *The Weary Blues*, in 1926, which captured the rhythms of jazz and blues. Over the next decades, Hughes wrote novels, plays, and newspaper columns that gave voice to African American culture and struggles.

He continued writing until his death in 1967, leaving behind a legacy of poetry that celebrated identity, resilience, and pride. Today, Hughes is remembered as a central figure in American literature and the Harlem Renaissance.
