French Revolution Timeline Challenge

Instructions: Below are eight event cards related to the French Revolution and Bastille Day. Each card includes a short description of a major event. Your task is to read all the cards carefully, then number them 1 through 8 to show the correct chronological order of events.

Event Cards



A. The National Assembly adopts the Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen, proclaiming liberty, equality, and fraternity as the foundation of a new France.
B. Thousands of angry Parisians storm the Bastille prison on July 14, 1789, seeking weapons and sending a clear message of resistance to the monarchy.
C. The Estates-General is called into session by King Louis XVI in May 1789 after nearly 175 years, due to a growing financial crisis in France.
D. The monarchy is officially abolished , and the French Republic is declared on September 21, 1792.
E. The Tennis Court Oath takes place, where members of the Third Estate vow not to separate until they create a new constitution.
F. King Louis XVI is executed by guillotine in January 1793, marking the end of royal authority.
G. Bastille Day becomes an official national holiday in France, beginning in 1880, to celebrate the revolution's legacy and unity.
H. Robespierre leads the Reign of Terror , executing thousands of people suspected of opposing the revolution.
