• Differentiation Tips:

- o For English learners, highlight the words that follow *because* (verb) and *because of* (noun).

Engagement Ideas:

- Use a "Cause Hunt" game: students find cause-and-effect statements in a story or article and replace connectors with *because* or *because* of correctly.
- Let pairs race to fix or match causes and effects on the board.

Extension Ideas:

- o Have students write a mini paragraph about a surprising event using at least three *because* and *because* of sentences.
- o Encourage students to create their own set of mixed-up sentences for classmates to solve.
