

Newsroom Rewrite Answer Key

Formal Rewrite Example: Students at Brookwood Middle School were excited about the grand opening of their new greenhouse. The structure was built **behind** the science wing last month after months of planning. **Behind** the greenhouse, a small compost area was added for students to recycle food waste from the cafeteria. During the ribbon-cutting ceremony, teachers stood **behind** the student council president as she gave her speech. The principal hopes the space **behind** the school will inspire more hands-on environmental learning.

Teacher's Guide

- **Skill Focus:** Editing for tone and formality by replacing informal expressions (**in back of**) with their formal equivalent (**behind**).
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Have struggling learners highlight all informal prepositions first before rewriting.
 - Challenge advanced learners to revise additional words to make the article sound more professional (e.g., "excited" → "enthusiastic").
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Let students act as "news editors," reading aloud their polished versions and comparing tones.
 - Create a quick "before and after" bulletin board featuring casual vs. formal rewrites.
- **Extension Activity:**
 - Ask students to write a short, original "school news" article of their own using **behind** correctly at least three times to show formal tone mastery.
