Teacher's Guide

- **Skill Focus:** Students learn the difference between **behind** (formal, appropriate for academic and written contexts) and **in back of** (informal, used mainly in spoken English).
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For struggling learners, read the sentences aloud and emphasize tone and setting to identify which fits formal writing.
 - For advanced students, have them rewrite informal sentences using **behind** and explain why it's more formal.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn it into a "Formal vs. Informal Detective" game where students circle clues that signal formality.
 - Have students create two short dialogues—one casual using **in back of**, one formal using **behind**.
- **Extension Activity:**
 - Ask students to write a short descriptive paragraph of a location (e.g., a playground or classroom) using **behind** correctly three times.
