Formal Essay Rewrite (Example): Yesterday, my friends and I explored an old garden behind the library that resembled a picturesque scene from a storybook. Teacher's Guide

• **Skill Focus**: Improving tone and precision through prepositional correction and vocabulary choice; recognizing how **behind** elevates writing formality compared to **in back of**.

• Differentiation Tips:

- Provide struggling learners with a word bank of formal replacements (e.g., "cool" → "impressive," "talking" → "conversing").
- Challenge advanced students to expand the paragraph with a formal concluding sentence reflecting on the value of public green spaces.

• Engagement Ideas:

- Have students read both versions aloud to hear how tone changes through diction and preposition use.
- Conduct a "Tone Detective" activity where students highlight informal words in one color and formal replacements in another.

Extension Activity:

 Ask students to create their own short blog entry using in back of and then rewrite it as a formal version using behind, comparing both for audience appropriateness.
