(Sample Responses)

- 1. "Fate goes ever as fate must."
 - Paraphrase: Things will happen as destiny decides.
 - Meaning: Shows the Anglo-Saxon belief in wyrd, or fate, as an unchangeable force.
 - Theme: Fate and inevitability.
- 2. "I shall win the gold by my courage, or else mortal combat, doom of battle, will bear your lord away."
 - Paraphrase: I will win treasure through bravery, or die fighting.
 - Meaning: Beowulf values courage and glory, even at the risk of death.
 - Theme: Heroism and mortality.
- 3. "Grendel, who haunted the moors, the wild marshes, and made his home in a hell not hell but earth."
 - o Paraphrase: Grendel lived in the swamps, a place like hell on earth.
 - Meaning: Shows Grendel as both monstrous and connected to human fears of exile and isolation.
 - Theme: Fvil and the outsider.
- 4. "So every man must yield the leasehold of his days."
 - Paraphrase: Every person must give up their life when their time ends.
 - Meaning: Emphasizes the inevitability of death and the temporary nature of human life.
 - o *Theme:* Mortality.
- 5. "Wiglaf spoke wise and fluent words: 'We swore that loyalty long ago.'"
 - Paraphrase: Wiglaf reminds the warriors they once promised loyalty.
 - Meaning: Highlights the comitatus bond of loyalty between warrior and lord.
 - o Theme: Loyalty and duty.
