2.	How does the bond between Beowulf and his men demonstrate the value of comitatus (loyalty between a lord and his warriors)?
3.	Beowulf accepts that his death is determined by wyrd (fate). What does this reveal about Anglo-Saxon attitudes toward destiny?
4.	Why is treasure and gift-giving important in the poem, and what does this tell us about Anglo-Saxon views of kingship and honor?
 5.	At the end of the poem, Beowulf's people build him a huge barrow (burial mound). What does this memorial say about how the Anglo-Saxons valued legacy and remembrance?
