(Sample Responses)

- Beowulf fights Grendel without weapons to prove his courage and fairness, reflecting the Anglo-Saxon value of bravery in combat and the idea of honorable battle.
- The loyalty between Beowulf and his men shows comitatus, the code that bound warriors to support their lord in battle, highlighting trust and duty as key values.
- Beowulf's acceptance of wyrd reveals that the Anglo-Saxons believed destiny was inevitable and that true heroism lay in meeting fate with honor.
- 4. Treasure and gift-giving symbolized honor and bonds of loyalty; Anglo-Saxon kings were expected to share wealth to show generosity and secure loyalty.
- Beowulf's great burial mound reflects the importance of legacy and remembrance, as Anglo-Saxons believed lasting fame was the only form of immortality.
