

Preposition Expedition Answer Key

Sample Revision

Yesterday, I had to choose **between** two summer camps. It was a tough decision because both had great activities. My best friends, Tara and Liam, helped me decide by sharing their experiences. Tara said she loved the teamwork **among** all the campers at Adventure Lake, while Liam preferred the creativity **among** the group at Art Quest. I ended up picking Adventure Lake because I wanted to be **among** friends who enjoy sports and outdoor fun. At the end of the day, I felt happy **between** the two choices I had.

Justification Example: I used **between** when comparing only two camps or choices, and **among** when referring to groups of people or activities involving more than two participants.

Teacher's Guide

- **Skill Focus:** This worksheet builds understanding of the contextual difference between **between** (used for two distinct items) and **among** (used for groups or three or more).
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Provide a mini chart or example list before the exercise for visual learners.
 - Let advanced students justify their edits orally to strengthen grammar reasoning.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn the activity into a "Grammar Editing Race" where pairs compete to find all errors quickly.
 - Encourage peer editing sessions so students can discuss reasoning for each correction.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Have students write their own short diary entry that misuses the prepositions, then swap with a partner to correct.
 - Challenge learners to find examples of **between** and **among** in their reading materials and explain why each fits its context.
