Example Response

Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Encourage empathy, descriptive writing, and reflective thinking by connecting creative expression to the theme of generosity.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - *Grades 5-6:* Provide sentence starters such as "My box would include..." or "I would give this to..."
 - *Grades 7-8:* Challenge students to expand their paragraph into a short persuasive essay explaining why giving matters.
- **Engagement Idea:** Have students decorate a "paper box" (drawn or folded) and write their item descriptions inside for a classroom display titled "Boxes of Kindness."
- **Extension Activity:** Invite students to research a real charity or community organization and write a letter offering to help or donate items inspired by their Boxing Day box idea.
