Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Read sentences aloud and allow students to choose feelings verbally if writing is difficult.
 - Provide picture cues for each emotion to support comprehension.
 - Offer fewer choices from the word bank for emerging learners.
- **Engagement Strategies:**
 - Have students act out one of the sentences to show what empathy looks like.
 - Discuss real-life examples of when they or others felt the same emotions.
 - Encourage students to pair-share why empathy helps build stronger friendships.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Ask students to create their own empathy sentences using new feeling words.
 - Use the completed worksheet to start a classroom "Feelings Circle" discussion.
 - Incorporate art by having students draw faces showing each feeling from the word bank.
