- Accurate province or territory.
- A description of geographic features such as mountains, coastlines, forests, waterfalls, or cityscapes.
- A clear explanation of cultural, historical, or environmental importance.
- One interesting fact that adds depth to the report.
- A paragraph showing understanding of location and significance.

Teacher's Guide

- Ideal for project based learning or introduction to Canadian landmarks.
- Encourage students to use **maps**, **atlases**, or classroom resources for location details.
- Provide time for students to organize their answers before writing the final paragraph.

Differentiation Tips

- For Grades 5 to 6:
 - Offer a short fact sheet or brief description of several landmarks.
 - Allow students to write their paragraph using sentence starters.
- For Grades 7 to 9:
 - Require students to cite one researched source.
 - Encourage use of more advanced geographic vocabulary.
- For Grades 10 to 12:
 - Assign an additional requirement such as discussing tourism impacts or cultural preservation.
 - Ask students to compare their chosen landmark to another in Canada.
