Directions: Read the information about four Canadian symbols. Then answer the analysis questions using complete sentences.

Maple Leaf: The maple leaf has been connected to Canada for hundreds of years. Maple trees grow in many parts of the country, and their leaves became a recognizable sign of Canadian identity.

Beaver: The beaver is an important national symbol because it played a major role in Canada's early fur trade. Its hardworking nature also represents determination and cooperation.

National Flag: Canada's flag has two red bars and a red, eleven pointed maple leaf in the center. The colors and design were chosen to represent unity, pride, and the natural environment.

National Anthem: The anthem, **O Canada**, is sung at national events and celebrations. It expresses love, loyalty, and respect for the country.
