• Sentence 1:

Cause → snowstorm lasted all night

Effects → the school buses could not drive on the icy roads, the teachers stayed home, the students enjoyed a surprise snow day

Sentence 2:

Cause → bakery had a power outage

Effects → the ovens stopped working, the bread did not rise, customers had to wait until the afternoon to buy fresh rolls

• Sentence 3:

Cause → Lena forgot to water her plants

Effects → the leaves turned brown, the flowers wilted, her room looked less cheerful

Sample Student Response (will vary)

Cause \rightarrow It rained heavily all weekend.

Effects → The soccer game was canceled, the park became muddy, and kids stayed inside to play board games.

Teacher Notes / Guide

- Focus Skill: Students practice recognizing multiple effects from one stated cause.
- Differentiation: For younger or struggling readers, shorten passages or reduce effects to one or two. For advanced readers, challenge them to add chains of effects (one effect leading to another).
- Discussion Prompt: Ask: "Why might an author include many effects from one cause in a passage? How does this help readers understand the situation better?"
