Causes in Each Passage

Passage 1

Effect → streets were flooded

Causes → wind howled through the trees, heavy rain fell for hours, riverbanks overflowed, drains clogged with leaves

Passage 2

Effect → Jamie was late to school

Causes → Jamie stayed up late watching a movie, he forgot to set his alarm, his phone battery died overnight

Passage 3

Effect → customers had to wait a long time for their drinks

Causes → the café ran out of milk, the delivery truck was delayed, many customers ordered lattes that morning

Sample Student Response (answers will vary)

Example:

Passage → Ella left her homework on the bus, her printer at home was broken, and she spilled juice on her notebook. Effect: Ella had nothing to hand in to her teacher.

Causes (underlined) → left her homework on the bus, printer was broken, spilled juice on her notebook

Teacher Notes / Guide

 Focus Skill: Students learn that multiple causes often build toward a single effect.

• Differentiation:

- Support: Provide shorter passages with only two causes.
- o *Challenge*: Ask advanced students to create passages where causes are less obvious (e.g., implied rather than directly stated).
- **Discussion Prompt**: "Why is it important to look for all the causes of one effect in a story or real-life event?"
