Part 2: Answers will vary. Students should show the emotion through actions only. For example, a nervous character might tap their foot or avoid eye contact.

Teacher's Guide

- Introduce the idea that **actions help readers understand how a character feels**, even when the emotion is not said.
- Model one example by acting out an emotion and asking students to identify clues from body movement and behavior.
- For differentiation, provide sentence starters such as "The character..." or a word bank of simple actions.
- For extension, have students create a short scene using two different emotions or draw a comic panel showing a character's emotion through action.
