Guess That Character

Directions: Read the short scene below with your group.



1. Choose one student to read aloud a line from the passage in an **expressive voice** that matches one of the characters.
2. Other students must guess which character the reader is pretending to be, based only on the voice.
3. Rotate turns so everyone gets a chance to read and guess.
4. Afterward, discuss the reflection questions together.
