Meet Your New Study Buddy!

Studying doesn't always mean staring at your notes until your eyes blur. Sometimes the best way to learn is to have someone *ask* you questions - like a study partner or tutor.

That's where **ChatGPT** can help.

You can ask ChatGPT to quiz you on vocabulary, math problems, history facts, or even science concepts you're learning. The trick is to give it good directions (a *prompt*) so it gives you a quiz that fits your level.

In this activity, you'll practice asking ChatGPT to make and give you a short quiz. Then you'll reflect on how it helped - and what you'd change next time to make studying even better.

Directions

1. Pick a Subject or Topic - Choose something you're studying this week - vocabulary, math, social studies, or science.

2. Ask ChatGPT for a Quiz - Use this sentence as your prompt: "Please quiz me on [topic]. Give me 5 questions one at a time, and wait for me to answer each before telling me if I'm right."

(You can adjust the number of questions or the difficulty - that's part of the experiment!)

3. Take the Quiz! - Answer each question in ChatGPT's chat. Be honest - no peeking!

4. Record Two Questions and Answers Below - Choose two questions that stood out (one you got right, one you got wrong or found tricky).

3. Why is it still important to check your notes and other sources - even when ChatGPT helps you study?
