Teacher's Guide

- Quick implementation: Review that checks are normally numbered consecutively and transaction dates help organize checkbook records.
- Differentiation: Have students first number the six transaction dates from earliest to latest before assigning check numbers.
- Differentiation: For additional support, provide the first two check numbers, 2051 and 2052, and let students continue the pattern.
- Engagement: Have students act as bookkeepers checking whether a partner's dates and check numbers follow the correct sequence.
- Extension: Ask students to add two later transactions and assign the next two check numbers.
