Sample Chart Answers

Character	Trait #1 (with evidence)	Trait #2 (with evidence)
Little Red	<i>Innocent/Naïve</i> - She easily tells the Wolf where Grandma lives.	<i>Caring</i> - She brings a basket of food to help her sick grandmother.
The Wolf	<i>Tricky/Deceptive</i> - He disguises himself as Grandma to fool Little Red.	<i>Clever</i> - He runs ahead and plans a trap before Little Red arrives.
Grandma	<i>Vulnerable</i> - She is bedridden and cannot defend herself from the Wolf.	<i>Loving</i> - She welcomes Little Red and is happy to see her granddaughter.

Reflection Sample Answer

It is important to use text evidence because it proves that our ideas about characters are correct. Without examples from the story, our answers might just be guesses. Evidence shows how the character's words and actions reveal their true personality.

Teacher Notes

- Scaffold for younger students: provide a **list of possible traits** (brave, kind, clever, tricky, caring, etc.) and let students match them with characters.
- Extension: Ask students to add one more trait for each character and explain if it is a **positive or negative trait**.
- Discussion prompt: How might the story change if Little Red were more cautious or if the Wolf were less clever?
