## **Passport to Christmas: Global Holiday Traditions**

You've been given a **magical Christmas passport** that lets you travel the globe in one night! Your mission is to visit **five different countries** and learn about their **unique holiday traditions**. After reading each **"Travel Note"**, complete the matching activity and answer the questions at the end.



#### Travel Note #1 - Mexico

In Mexico, the holiday season includes **Las Posadas**, a nine-day celebration from December 16th to 24th. Families reenact Mary and Joseph's search for shelter by visiting homes and singing songs. There are often piñatas, music, and fireworks. On Christmas Eve, families gather for a large feast and attend Midnight Mass.

#### Travel Note #2 - Japan

In Japan, Christmas is celebrated in a more secular way, and one surprising tradition is eating **fried chicken from KFC**! This started as a marketing campaign in the 1970s and became a beloved custom. People also enjoy strawberry shortcake and light displays, and it's considered a romantic holiday for couples.

#### Travel Note #3 - Germany

Germany is famous for its **Christmas markets**, or *Weihnachtsmärkte*. These markets are filled with handmade crafts, wooden toys, hot drinks, and festive foods like roasted nuts and sausages. A well-known figure is **St. Nicholas**, who leaves small gifts in children's shoes on the night of December 5th.

#### Travel Note #4 - Australia

Because it's summer during December in Australia, many families celebrate Christmas with a **barbecue on the beach!** Traditional foods may include seafood, cold salads, and pavlova for dessert. Carol singing still happens, but often outdoors in parks with candlelight.

#### Travel Note #5 - Italy

In Italy, many families celebrate with a big Christmas Eve dinner and attend **Midnight Mass**. On January 6th, children receive gifts from **La Befana**, a kind old woman who flies on a broomstick. She's said to visit homes, much like Santa Claus, and leaves candy for well-behaved children.
