Part 1: Understanding Purpose

- 1. Dr. King is sharing his vision of a just and equal future, where suffering and injustice are replaced by fairness and unity.
- 2. He uses religious language to connect emotionally with his audience and to present the Civil Rights Movement as a moral, almost sacred cause. Many in his audience were people of faith, especially in the Black church community.

Part 2: Analyzing Tone

- 3. Circle: Hope, Inspiration, Urgency
- 4. Example: "This is our hope. This is the faith..." These lines reinforce a hopeful tone and show that despite hardship, King believes in a better future.

Part 3: Evaluating Impact

- 5. His audience included civil rights activists, political leaders, and the American public. This passage speaks powerfully to people seeking justice and unity, using uplifting imagery.
- 6. It inspired many Americans to support civil rights legislation, such as the Civil Rights Act of 1964, by framing equality as part of a shared national dream.
