Reflection Question Guidance

- 1. Elizabeth recognizes she misjudged both Darcy and Wickham, showing pride in her judgment and prejudice clouded her view.
- 2. Her prejudice caused her to reject Darcy unfairly while overvaluing Wickham's false charm.
- 3. This moment is crucial: it is Elizabeth's **self-awareness turning point**, which shifts the direction of the novel.
- 4. By acknowledging her flaws, she becomes more open to Darcy's true character, making their eventual union believable and meaningful.

Teacher Notes:

- Stress that **internal conflict** is central to Elizabeth's growth; without it, her romance with Darcy would lack depth.
- Encourage students to see how Austen uses irony: Elizabeth, who prides herself on discernment, must admit she was mistaken.
- Accept varied interpretations as long as students provide textual evidence and logical reasoning.
