- 1. Raid on the Cicones
- 2. Encounter with the Lotus-Eaters
- 3. Blinding the Cyclops Polyphemus
- 4. Trapped by Circe (Aeaea)
- 5. Journey to the Land of the Dead (Tiresias)

- 6. Sirens (tied to the mast)
- 7. Scylla and Charybdis
- Cattle of Helios (crew destroyed)
- Captivity with Calypso (Ogygia)
- 10. Return to Ithaca and defeat of the suitors

Reflection Question Guidance

- 1. **Cleverness:** The Cyclops episode, where Odysseus uses the "Nobody" trick and blinds Polyphemus.
- 2. **Leadership/weakness:** Helios's cattle shows his inability to control his men; also Scylla/Charybdis where he sacrifices some to save most.
- 3. The timeline of struggles emphasizes how **perseverance**, **endurance**, **and the will of the gods** shape Odysseus's journey.
- 4. Student answers may vary:
 - Some may argue Odysseus grows wiser (he learns humility and respect for the gods).
 - Others may argue he remains prideful and clever but not fully changed.

Teacher Notes:

- This activity builds both **comprehension** (sequencing) and **analysis** (theme/character growth).
- Encourage students to note how storytelling order in Homer (nonlinear flashbacks) differs from chronological order.
- Students should support reflections with textual evidence of paraphrased details from the epic.
