## **Reflection Question Guidance**

- 1. Orwell = control through pain, fear, repression. Huxley = control through pleasure, distraction, conditioning.
- 2. Answers vary. Some may argue 1984 is scarier because of constant surveillance and brutality; others may argue Brave New World is scarier because people accept oppression without realizing it.
- 3. "Big Brother is Watching You" = fear, surveillance, obedience. "Community, Identity, Stability" = sacrifice individuality for social order.
- 4. Both warn against extremes: Orwell cautions against **authoritarian control and surveillance**; Huxley warns of **a culture numbed by pleasure**, **consumption**, **and technology**.

## **Teacher Notes:**

- Stress the **contrast**: Orwell's dystopia relies on pain and repression, while Huxley's relies on pleasure and conditioning.
- Encourage students to consider which dystopian features are most visible in today's world.
- Accept varied answers for reflections as long as they're supported with reasoning and evidence.
