Claude the Coach Sample Answer Key

Step 1 - Choose Your Challenge - Sample Student Choice:

"I want to learn how to write a haiku poem."

(Teacher note: The skill can vary-look for a choice that's specific and realistic for the student's age and subject area.)

Step 2 - Ask Claude to Teach It Step-by-Step - Student Prompt:

"Claude, can you teach me how to write a haiku poem step by step?"

Sample Claude Response:

- 1. A haiku is a three-line poem from Japan.
- 2. The first line has 5 syllables, the second has 7, and the third has 5.
- 3. Haiku usually describe nature or a moment in time.
- 4. Focus on strong imagery and simple language.
- 5. Count syllables carefully as you write!

Student Summary: Claude explained that a haiku has 3 lines (5-7-5 syllables) and should focus on nature or simple moments.

Step 3 - Try It Yourself! Student's Attempt: Gentle morning breeze, Whispers softly through the trees, Waking up the world

Student Reflection:, "It was hard to count syllables correctly, but Claude's step-by-step guide helped me stay organized."

(Teacher note: Look for evidence the student followed Claude's directions and made a genuine attempt at the skill.)

Step 4 - Ask for Feedback - Student Prompt to Claude:

"Here's my haiku: Gentle morning breeze / Whispers softly through the trees / Waking up the world. Can you give me feedback?"

Sample Claude Response: "That's a lovely haiku! It follows the 5-7-5 pattern perfectly and creates a calm image. You could make it even stronger by using a more specific detail-like a bird's call or the color of the sunrise."

Student Summary: Claude liked the imagery and pattern but suggested adding a more specific detail.
