First Read - Plot:

- 1. Elena is at a train station, preparing to leave her town for somewhere new.
- 2. She feels nervous and conflicted: excited to go, but also weighed down by hesitation.

Second Read - Language:

- 3. Strong words/phrases: "screeched," "knuckles white," "chest tightened," "church bell rang," "doors of the train glowed with warm light."
- 4. The church bell represents the familiar past, tradition, and her hometown. The glowing train doors symbolize opportunity, change, and the future.

Third Read - Theme:

- 5. A possible theme is: Leaving behind the familiar is difficult, but new opportunities require courage.
